I was so impressed to see Beech class produce 6 different bakes in one lesson! Beech class have been awarded chef of the week for this fantastic effort and teamwork skills demonstrated on Monday. In addition, Larch class were incredible, preparing a range of delicious sandwich fillings, as well as food labels and pricing. Also this week, Post 16 practiced making flat breads with poached eggs with mango chutney and fresh chilli. Elm & Holly made banana and walnut bread - this was absolutely delicious served warm with butter. Hazel class made soda bread with homemade leek and potato soup, this was a great session to develop knife skills and practice making a traditional Irish bread recipe. Oak class made homemade cheese straws, these irresistible buttery and crunchy bite size treats are a great way to introduce the rubbing in method. Next week, groups in year 8 will make cinnamon breakfast rolls, year 9 are making spiced soda bread rolls and year 10 learners will be making Indian inspired flat breads. In post 16 learners will be making soda breads with soup and Oak class will make courgette and apple muffins.

Outdoor Ed Highlights!

Our students have been working really hard on their map reading skills recently, so we've included some highlights below!







Safeguarding

This week, our safeguarding focus is Omegle - a website which many of our students are aware of and may be accessing. Omegle is a website that allows you to speak to strangers for live text or video chats. There is an option for adult (18+) content and a section for people aged 13+ with parental permission. However, it is known to feature inappropriate content and puts young people at risk of cyberbullying and exploitation. Our Parents and Carers guide to Omegle is featured on the next page.



Omegle is a website that pairs random strangers for live text or video chats. It first launched in 2009 and its slogan is "Talk to strangers!" There is an option for adult (18+) content and a section for people aged 13+ with parental permission. Anyone can use the site. Users simply go to Omegle.com and then choose 'Text' or 'Video' chat and the page states how many users are currently online. Depending on the time of day this can be hundreds of thousands. Omegle markets itself as a great way to meet new friends however has been known to feature pornography and inappropriate content within chats, so it's important parents are aware of the risks associated with the site.
